### Curry leads golfers at Junior tournament

LOCHLAND (TNS) — Defending champion Cathy Curry of Columbus led qualifiers with a course record 74 in Tuesday's opening round of the Nebraska State Junior Girls Golf Tournament.

Curry outdistanced eight qualifiers for the championship flight being played today. In second place of the opening round was Robin Scherer of West Point with an 81.

Liz Weekes of South Sioux City had the third best qualifying round for today's championship flight competition with an 82.

Jan Stanard of Aurora was fourth with an 83 and top contender Val Skinner of North Platte fired an 87.

Other championship flight qualifiers were Denise Tomsen of Columbus, 90; Kammy Maxfeldt of Holdrege, 91; and Susan Marchese of Omaha, 92.

Jill Christensen of Hastings and Shelly Godeken of Alma qualified for first flight competition. Christensen shot a 95 and Godeken tallied a 96.

The state tournament continues through Friday.

# Curry tops Skinner in Junior Girls golf

HASTINGS — Cathy Curry soared into the limelight Tuesday at Lochland Country Club as she captured medalist honors during the qualifying round of the Eighth Annual Nebraska Junior Girls' State Tournament. Miss Curry qualified with a course record of par 74.

The championship field for the tourney in progress here at Hastings rounded off to four remaining contenders in match play action Wednesday. By Thursday noon the remaining contenders for the 1977 honors were narrowed to two finalists.

What most consider the championship battle took place in the first round Wednesday when the '75, '76 defending champ, Cathy Curry, defeated 1976 medalist Val Skinner of North Platte, 3-2.

Other first round results among the eight championship flighters saw Liz Weekes of South Sioux City oust Kammy Maxfeldt of Holdrege 6-5, Robin Scherer of West Point nip Denise Thomsen of Columbus, 1-0 and Jan Stanard of Aurora beat Susan Marchese of Omaha, 3-2.

Skinner drops to the consolation semifinals, while Curry goes on to defend her title against Liz Weekes in the semi's match.

Finals in all flights will be Friday morning.

## Hopp defends title in Ladies City meet

HASTINGS — There is no place like home for Hobbie Hopp, especially when she is competing for a victory in golf.

Hopp overtook second round leader Doris Kadel by two strokes at her home course, Lochland Country Club, to win her second straight Hastings Ladies City Golf Tournament here Wednesday.

The two-time winner shot her best golf of the three-day event at her home course, blazing to a 44 on the front nine and repeating the score on the final half for an 88. Hopp finished the three-day, 54-hole tourney with a composite score of 218.

Second place finisher Kadel led Hopp Tuesday by outplaying her 88 to 89 at Elks Meadowbrook Country Club. But Kadel was able to take advantage of the situation on Tuesday — Elks is her home course.

Hopp and Kadel turned the championship flight of the 18-hole division into a two-player race for the title, as third place finisher Marge Smith trailed with a distant 228.

Marie Crabtree finished behind Smith by one stroke with a 54-hole total of 229. Mary Walley was fifth at 241.

MaDonna Bell topped the field in the 18-hole division president's flight with a 54-hole total of 249. Ruth Svoboda placed three strokes behind Bell for second place.

In the nine-hole division tournament finals held Wednesday at Elks Meadowbrook Country Club, Donna Granger won the first flight division with a three-day total of 151 — four strokes better than runner up Lou Bogan.

Judy Anderson was the second flight winner with a 163 while Elsie Karmazin was runner-up with a 165.

Jill Christensen, a high school student, won the third flight finals with a 154, finishing 12 strokes ahead of Gerry Plebuch and Marilyn Bergman who tied for second.

Fourth flight winner was Jean Portwood

who shot a three-day total of 178. Runner-up was Alice Erickson with a 181.

In the fifth flight, Marcy Vontz took the title with a 179.
